Readiness and Prospect of Sustainable Rice

Category	Date	Time:	Location

Rice plays an important role in Thailand as the main commodity for the nation's agricultural exports as well as a major staple food for the Thai population and livelihoods for smallholder farmers. Ensuring sustainability in the rice sector therefore is an important entry point to ensure sustainable livelihoods of farmers, and contribution of the sector to food security, poverty alleviation.

Under Thai-German relations, in cooperation with GIZ, Sustainable Rice Platform (SRP) and other private partners, several cooperation projects have been implemented since 2011 with the view to develop successful models and scaling up strategies for sustainable rice production and value chains.

To date, the projects have demonstrated improvement in economic, social and environmental aspects. In terms of the economic aspect, small farmers have shown clear reduction of production costs, improvement on product safety and quality, increase net profits and enhance their competitiveness in foreign markets as well as strengthen their capacity in sustainable rice production. For the social aspect, people will have enough rice for consumption at fair prices, and there will be more local employment. Regarding the environmental aspect, sustainable rice production will help increase natural resource use efficiency, minimize environmental and climate impacts (i.e. open burning, soil deterioration, greenhouse gas emissions, etc.). In addition, more farmers will be encouraged to adopt environmentally friendly systems, leading to greater market opportunities in today's world market trend. It is also a critical approach for Thai farmers to be accepted by the global community in helping to reduce global warming.

While considerable progress has been made, achieving such endeavor requires wider collaboration and partnership. This Side Event will be organized to share Thailand's experience and discuss the current readiness and future prospects as well as invite collaboration and partnership both from public and private sectors along the whole value chains.
